Jameson, professor emerita of chemistry and chemical engineering, was honored for her efforts in support of women in science, especially in academia.

"Many women are choosing not to go that route because they can see how difficult it is," Jameson said in an interview published in the Nov. 5 *UIC News*.

But the rewards are great, she said.

"The thing about a research career in science is that it's the kind of thing that you would do whether you get paid or not," she said.

"The doing of science is sufficiently interesting and exciting, and you go from one day to the next with a lot of expectations."
